




2018 contributions: \$427.71 billion by type of recipient organization (in billions of dollars – all figures are rounded)




Total Giving, 1978-2018 (in billions of dollars)






Giving to religion, 1978-2018

(in billions of dollars)




Individual giving as a percentage of disposable personal income, 1978-2018 (in current dollars)

- Churches can take it as it comes




Three Areas for Sustainability

- Financial: How to enhance generosity and stewardship?



Financial Sustainability

- Re-draft Budget ASAP draft
- Re-task your Leaders
- Start with Expenses First
 - Contracts, Mortgages, Subscriptions, Bankers, Leases, etc.
 - Salary Reductions, Furloughs, or Lay-offs
- Then Focus on Income


Easter Letter to Invoke Generosity

- 1. Do not say,
 - a. "I'd like remind you..." They know this.
 - b. "We have bills and obligations to pay..." Everyone does.
 - c. "I hate to ask you...". You should never hate asking Christians to give.
 - d. "If everyone could give just x". This has the opposite effect that is intended.
- 2. Instead say:
 - a. This is a request that I would rather make in person.
 - b. I need your help...
 - c. Giving in a time of need is the way of the Christian faith.
 - d. We are reaching our members and beyond with the love of God.
 - e. We are seeing a shortfall.


